At the SEPA Board of Directors meeting of November 21, 2007 in Saskatoon, the directors ratified new SEPA AWARDS.

The following is the criteria for these new Awards.:

- A. Individual- Full time Paid position
- B. Individual- David Lilley Annual Volunteer Award
- C. Community, Agency or Group

CRITERIA

A. INDIVIDUAL – PAID EMERGENCY PLANNER

This award is dedicated to the devoted fulltime, paid Emergency Planner/Manager/Coordinator /Responder.

THE NOMINEE

1. Is in a full time paid emergency planning or emergency management; emergency response position.
2. Has displayed exceptional and selfless dedication to improving the preparedness of the community/agency/region in which they're involved with.
3. Has provided leadership in their respective area of emergency management expertise.
4. Has been an advocate of Emergency Planning and Preparedness in all their activities
5. Has made exceptional efforts to facilitate, support and enable sound Emergency Planning in their area.

6. Has constantly looked for and pursued opportunities to improve their emergency management skills.

7. Is a current member of SEPA?

B. INDIVIDUAL – DAVID LILEY VOLUNTEER AWARD

This award is dedicated, on behalf of David's family and the community of Maple Creek, to the devoted part time volunteer emergency planner/manager/co-ordinator/responder.

THE NOMINEE:

1. Is in an un paid Emergency Planner/Manager/ Co-ordinator/Responder.
2. Has displayed exceptional and selfless dedication to improving the preparedness of the community/agency/region in which they're involved with.
3. Has provided leadership in their respective area of emergency management expertise.
4. Has been an advocate of Emergency Planning and Preparedness In all their activities.
5. Has made exceptional efforts to facilitate, support and enable sound Emergency Planning in their area.
6. Has constantly looked for and pursued opportunities to improve their emergency management skills.
7. Is a current member of SEPA.

Note: unpaid includes positions that receive a small annual honorarium, reimbursement of travel expenses and sponsorship for attending training.

C. COMMUNITY AGENCY OR GROUP

This award is dedicated to the organization, a community or a group that through its

commitment to Emergency Preparedness and Management serves as a model for other communities, groups or agencies. [The recipient of this award will be nominated by SEPA for recognition at Saskatchewan Municipal Awards.](#)

THE NOMINEE:

1. Has embraced the concept of Emergency Preparedness and actively promoted awareness of all its residents / members or employees.
2. Has developed its plan and coordinated it with community stakeholders and agencies s - i.e. schools, hospitals, R.C.M.P., business, municipal plans, etc.
3. Has diligently reviewed, updated, and exercised their plan on an annual basis.
4. Has ensured that their personnel receive the training required.
5. Has at least one member of the group/agency Of community as a current member of SEPA.

NOTE:

1. All nominations must be signed by the nominator.
 2. Nominations must be made prior to March 9th of the current year.
 3. The Board of Directors will be announcing the candidates and recognize the deserving individuals or communities /groups /agencies at our annual SEPA Annual Convention.
